## St John's church Shirley have agreed to become an ECO CHURCH

**Eco Church** is a scheme managed in England and Wales by A Rocha UK to help Churches demonstrate care for God's Earth. ... It's about incorporating the biblical ethic of environmental stewardship into the spiritual values, practical action and community involvement of Church congregations.

Churches complete the unique online Eco Survey about how they are caring for God's earth in different areas of their life and work. The answers a church provides will collect points towards an Eco Church Award – the more your church does, the more points you get!

The survey takes you through five key areas of church life:

- Worship and teaching
- Management of church buildings
- Management of church land
- Community and global engagement
- Lifestyle

It takes into account whether or not your church has buildings or land, and you can save your survey responses at any point and return to update them as your church completes additional actions.

More information as the year goes on.

Did you complete a wild bird watch in your garden or the churchyard last weekend?

You have until 11th February to submit your return to RSPB. It's what you see—or what you don't see that gives them a picture of the state of our wildlife.

## The 2020 Bishop's Lent Call launches in parishes.


The projects supported are in Zimbabwe, The Holy Land, Kenya and in each of Southwark's Episcopal Areas.





### ST JOHN'S CHURCHYARD

John Talbot White described 'the churchyard', God's acre, as one of the most enduring features of the landscape. Together with the church it forms the physical as well as the spiritual centre of the community. It is the most sacred and usually the most ancient enclosure in the parish.



The memorials, public and private, are a tangible link between the in-

habitants today and their forebears. The churchyard is the centre of communal worship and celebration, the site of the most important occasions of life, baptism, marriage and burial.

Here at St. John's we have an opportunity with the launch of our 'Eco-Church', to promote our wonderful amenity in a sensitive and positive way.

Enlisting the help of our grounds management team we are working on a plan to develop areas within the churchyard where we can cultivate "Plants of The Bible". Planting these in discrete areas and labelling them gives us the added opportunity to create a leaflet which can be a guide to a churchyard ramble, maybe with a check list, rather like our 'historic churchyard trail'.

Work has started clearing some unkempt areas and as funding becomes available we look forward to the scheme enhancing this community conservation area.

The daffodils and other spring bulbs and plants are coming through this month which encourages us on. Spring will soon be here.
