

We're fixing the holes where the rain gets in' - to misquote the Beatles song.

The spire of St John-the-Evangelist Church has enhanced the Shirley landscape since 1854. But a more recent, less welcome feature is the flocks of noisy, destructive parakeets. The spire was repaired with cedar shingles in 2007, but these have not withstood the birds' continued ravages. Patching up is no longer the answer; it would be better to replace all the remaining shingles with far more durable oak, estimated to cost £35,000.



The Church was designed by Sir George Gilbert Scott, one of the family of prolific architects whose designs include the Foreign Office and the St Pancras Hotel and Station. St John's was consecrated by Bird Sumner, Archbishop of Canterbury, in 1856. The Rev'd William Wilks, vicar from 1879 to 1912, cultivated the white and red Shirley Poppy and was instrumental in establishing the Chelsea Flower Show.

So St. John's are launching a Church Spire Appeal Fund

Spire Appeal events. Music, important in the life of the church, also features in the Spire Appeal, and St John's is hosting two local musical groups:

On Saturday 22 June at 7:30pm Utopians Unlimited perform works by Gilbert & Sullivan including a costumed production of 'Trial by Jury'. The Utopians have previously presented Yeomen of the Guard at St John's and a concert of G&S favourites.

Saturday 6th July, at 7pm. **Musical duo Graham** & Jamie presents a concert themed Music Through The Ages, starting with the 1920s . Jamie Bull is a singer-pianist with a South London Elton John tribute band. Graham is a bass guitarist and singer who has performed with Jamie at three previous charity events at St Johns.

Friday 13th to Sunday 15th September: Flower Festival: theme *For the beauty of the Earth* will feature musical interludes, an all-day café and a Saturday night concert; it will also support the Shrublands Food Bank.
