We have been in liaison with our grounds maintenance team to ensure that the strimming of the grass has allowed access to the graves whilst allowing the flowers to survive. Unfortunately some of the flowers have gone to seed (Good news!) but the petals have fallen. However Jane has also surveyed many of the grasses so a stroll around will still be interesting.
