

Large numbers of Painted Lady Butterflies have been arriving in Britain this summer. The



butterflies migrate to the UK each summer where its caterpillars feed on thistles. Every ten years or so there is a "Painted Lady Summer" when they arrive en masse and the last was is 2008 when about 11million arrived before flying back to Europe and Africa.

St John's churchyard presents the right habitat and in late July one was spotted on the path behind the Tamberlin Room.

The charity, British Butterfly Conservation is urging people to spot and record painted ladies and several other species of common butterflies during 'The Big Butterfly Count' which runs until August 11th. Look for details on Google.

Minutes of Fundraising Committee meeting held on Wednesday 10 July 2019 at 8pm in the Parish Office

Present: Paul Campbell, Karen Holmes, Janet Martin, John Kingdom, Tim Roberson.

Apologies. None.

Review of fundraising events so far

- Sale of tomato plants
- Utopians (22 June) raised around £900 of which £720 represented ticket sales (72 @ £10). Expenses were Utopians £320, bar £65. Net about £500. Interest in G&S appears to be declining. For the most part it is a generational interest.
- Graham and Jamie grossed about £700. Expenses to be deducted not available at time of the meeting.

Funds raised to date - need for a visible indicator of progress

- In addition to the above, there have been a number of donations, exact amount snot known. Also Helen Tucker's sale of tomato plants. Ask Treasurer to confirm figures.
- The Flower Festival
 - so far has attracted £570 in sponsorship and raised £130 through plant sales. Unlike previous festivals there has been no need to put in money for expenses up front.
 - Two raffles are planned, 1 over the three days and one at the concert.
 - o Janet to circulate FS minutes to this committee to keep us informed.
- We need to be able to chart progress with fund raising. By the end of the Flower festival we should have a significant amount to report towards the £35k target.
- Buy a Shingle £5 was agreed as a reasonable sum whether or not it represents £35k/number of shingles. Circulate appeal details alongside flower fest leaflets.

More publicity for appeal

- Appeal banner could go up on the scaffolding. Work is due to start by 2 September and take 14 weeks.
- Flower Fest. Rowena is using a range of local interest web sites, local churches including St Mildred's and residents associations, SPA, MORA and North Shirley (covers eastern end of parish).
- press Graham and Jamie received publicity through the Croydon Advertiser.
- Previous invitations to our MP, mayor, ward councillors etc have been difficult to arrange and subject to short notice cancellation. Not worth the effort involved.

Future events

- FKs 23 Nov date is confirmed. Paul to liaise with joint chairs on format and proposed programme.
- Quiz night had been arranged for 12 October. Proposed venue St J School.
- Concerts including St John's church choir, Jackie Cheeseman's choir all subject to confirmation of availability and dates.
